

The jewish area in the Marais

Other jewish areas to visit ?

Synagogue 44, rue de la Victoire 75009

The most important in Paris (1000 seats) and in France, maybe even in Europe. Built in 1974. Métro Notre Dame de Lorette (line 12) or Le Peletier (line 7)

With the rue Richer, its shops and restaurants

Jewish area in Belleville (sefarade)

Boulevard de Belleville, between métro Couronnes and métro Belleville (line 2) – 75020

71 rue du Temple – métro Hôtel de ville – Also located in the Marais area, close to the walking tour described – open every day except on Saturdays from 11am to 6pm – very interesting and in a nice Hôtel particulier in the Marais.

- 3 The oldest synagogue in Paris: 17 rue des Rosiers – 1st floor ½ (not accessible)
- 4 Synagogues – 18 rue des Ecouffles: oratoire Fleischman (in the yard: mostly open)
- 5 Old boucherie: red mosaic
- 6 Middle age house: 13 rue F Miron
- 7 Maison européenne de la photographie (from 11am to 8pm, except on Monday and Tuesday)
- 8 Place du marché Sainte Catherine
- 9 Maison de Victor Hugo
- 10 Synagogue 21 rue des Tournelles – the 2nd biggest in Paris
- 11 Square Georges Cain
- 12 Musée Carnavalet (closed on Monday)
